

Making the **MOST** of your **CAMPUS VISIT**

PLANNING AHEAD

- Call in advance to schedule your visit when school is in session.
- Ask them to send you a map of the campus and any brochures with photos.
- Schedule an appointment to talk with an admissions officer.
- Create a list of questions to ask while you are there.
- Have a pen and paper handy.
- Plan to stay an entire day. Some schools may even offer overnight boarding to visitors.
- Don't forget your camera.

NOW THAT YOU'VE ARRIVED

- Take a campus tour.
- Ask questions. Talk to students and professors.
- Attend a game or event.
- Sit in on a class in the major of your interest, if possible.
- Check out the dorms, student center, cafeteria, athletic facilities and libraries.

THINGS TO OBSERVE AND CONSIDER

- How big are the dorm rooms? How do other students have their rooms arranged?
- How are students spending most of their time? (studying, socializing, etc.)
- Do most of the students commute or live on campus?
- What are the nearby attractions?

QUESTIONS TO ASK

- Which students can live in the dorms? Freshmen? Seniors?
- Do you have to share a room?
- What are the criteria to determine who your room mates will be?
- What is campus security like? Is there a campus police station?
- Does the school have fraternities and sororities on campus?
- What sports are played? Are they varsity, intramural or club teams?
- What clubs and extra curricular activities are available on campus?
- What is the policy on visitors? Can Mom, Dad or siblings stay on campus?
